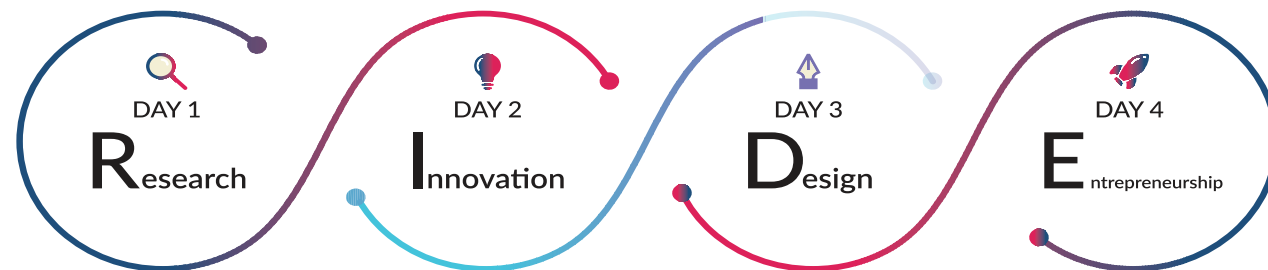

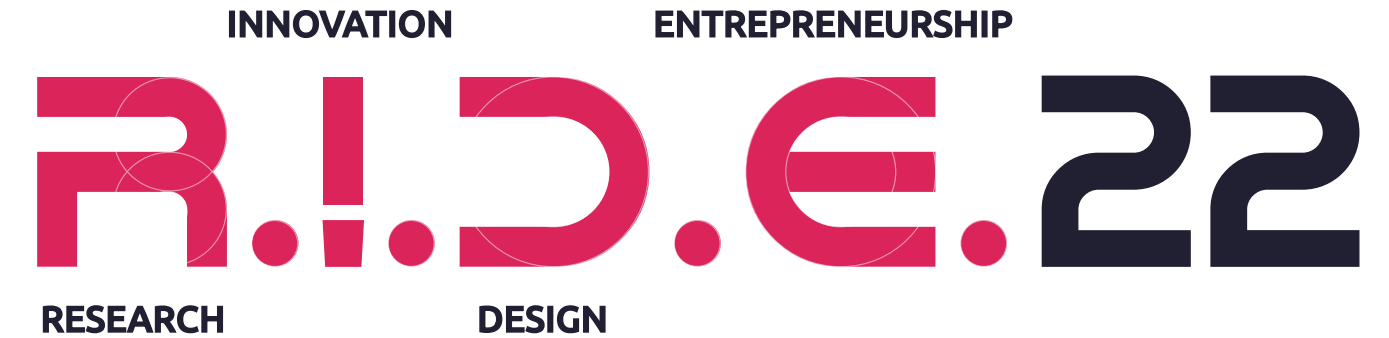

Objective

- ◆ Innovation drives growth and helps address social challenges. Innovation mitigates climate change, advances sustainable development, and promotes social cohesion. Given the importance of innovation and entrepreneurship in today's world, it is crucial to provide young people with the chance to study the **"what," "how,"** and **"why"** of these subjects.
- ◆ We feel innovation is something that is not limited to a single stream of study, hence the event was made credit-based for **2nd-year undergraduate students and 1st-year postgraduate students** across the university.
- ◆ Today's problems call for creative applications of new technology, new organisational structures, network processes to increase human and social capital, and new solutions from the bottom up. This is how and why we developed R.I.D.E, a curriculum that methodically informs students about each subject crucial to starting a business: **Research, Innovation, Design, and Entrepreneurship.**

Outcome

- ◆ All industries have benefited from the systematic promotion of innovation and entrepreneurship by MITWPU R.I.D.E 22. The main objective was to **promote, support, inspire, and develop** creative talent around the world.
- ◆ Students were able to learn about different industries and how they functioned thanks to the experienced speakers who came from diverse fields. Additionally, pupils were able to clearly comprehend the **"what," "how," and "why" of innovation and entrepreneurship.**
- ◆ As R.I.D.E 2022 became a credit-based programme for 2nd-year Undergraduate students and 1st-year Postgraduate students across the university, these **credits** were awarded based on a report submitted by students on any of their ideas, working, and even attempting to build a business model for it.

Day 01

Namita Thapar Executive Director, Emcure Pharmaceuticals Ltd.

Gracing our Inauguration day with her presence, we had Namita Thapar on stage. She spoke about many things motivating our students but when asked what she looked for in startups or founders before investing she replied, **"Hunger and Humility"**

She explained these two words in great detail so that the attendees would have a better understanding of them. She began with defining the word "Hunger" before telling stories of her father and his drive to work even at the age of 71 for an improved future.

She continued by describing how she was given the chance to oversee the Indian division of Emcure Pharmaceuticals.

The duty wasn't handed to her on a silver platter; rather, it came after she demonstrated a desire, a hunger for it and excelled throughout her one-year probationary period. She told the students the importance of being humble and modest.

She mentions a dialogue **'Kabil bano, kamyabi jhak marke tumhare piche daudegi'**.

She ended her much appreciated speech by giving the audience motivation to give back to our country and serve the nation through our knowledge.



Day 01

Satyabhushan Dash Director, Centre of Emerging Markets, IIM Lucknow

Mr Satyabhushan Dash from IIM Lucknow graced the RIDE22 inauguration ceremony. He spoke on establishing an entrepreneurial attitude and how vital it is. He began his talk by emphasizing how sustainability plays a crucial role in our daily life. He discussed what sustainability is, how it benefits society and the environment, and how we should design goods that benefit society.

Furthermore, he provided several instances from our daily lives that may assist us and the people around us in adapting to a sustainable living

via the use of new technology, some of which were water ATMs and interrupted energy supplies as well as good public transit.

He spoke about many elements of innovation, such as how a Green hotel that he visited benefits the environment, how many inventions, such as Tata's new hybrid vehicle, assists the environment, and is sustainable. It is not only leading in all of these categories, but it is also benefiting Tata for its expanding company.

In the conclusion he quoted **"Sustainability is the future and any innovation in sustainability is the customer's requirement!!"**



Mr. Rahul Walawalkar Director, IESA Pune

Mr Rahul Walawalkar, the director of IESA PUNE, spoke to the MIT students on the first day of RIDE22. He began his discussion by thanking the organizers for hosting this event and discussing the collaboration with MIT. He then gave a basic introduction of the IESA. He explained to the audience how India is a worldwide center for research and industry. He demonstrated to the audience how, over the previous decade, there has been enormous progress in technical advancement by using many real-world examples that we as growing adults have observed, such as lightweight computers or mobile phones with longer battery life in the same footprint or upgraded lithium and lithium-ion batteries.

He highlighted that with new technologies, cost reduction is achievable and that innovation is not over.



He stated that they want to ensure this in the following decade. People don't have to leave India to have an effect in the world, and they believe that with the sort of policies the government is now putting in place, as well as the kind of passion that exists in the business. Similarly, he believes that MIT will undertake similar projects in the future years. In conclusion, he stated that **"This is a decade for advanced energy storage technologies."**

Mr. Shailendra Kawade Chairman, Mylab Discovery Solutions Pvt Ltd.

Mr. Shailendra kawade spoke to the audience about research, accessibility difficulties, and solutions. He stated that he picked this topic because when anybody speaks about any business, you have to talk about the problem and the answer to each startup. He also explained how his firm develops various tools that make life easier for people and provide them assistance. Mr. Shailendra recommended the audience to always strive to identify the accessibility, or sectors of this particular division, & find out how they receive their answers from the environment.

He spoke about how every firm was a startup at one point, and every company has encountered challenges.

If science is one of them, then your problem has a solution from every viewpoint. It has nothing to do with the issue. It is about science, whether it is about the stream or not. **So, proceed with caution as the best notion.**

In conclusion, he hoped that this specific event would light a fire in the minds of the audience, causing them to notice more and more issues and come up with more and more answers, cooperating, conducting study throughout the world, and discovering or taking hints from that.



Day 02

Mr. Dheeman Kadam Co-Founder at goEgoNetwork

Mr Dheeman Kadam, Co-Founder at goEgoNetwork started his address to the audience by showing a video which aimed to promote sustainability and green products, and a green lifestyle by showcasing the use of EV's.

He explained that the problem statement that people are scared of buying electric bikes or electric cars is range anxiety, so they decided to innovate that by putting a charging station at the world's highest peak. That's at Kaza. Mr Kadam then started talking about his company and what they do there. He gave motivation to students by telling them how his company had raised funding multiple times successfully.

Further he said, "I as an entrepreneur, I as a co-founder and I as a person who was sitting there 14 years back, that's what has worked for me. Always remember that there is opportunity.

Further he spoke about how he is an alumna of MIT-WPU.

He said, "The community in Pune is really small. So anyone who needs mentoring or who needs even just a sounding board, can come up, reach out and I'm happy to talk to all the MIT guys, at least you all are I'm the alumni here. So I have certain obligations towards you all so that's something which we would love to do".

In conclusion, he quoted the great boxer Muhammad Ali, **"Champions are not made in the ring they are merely recognized."**



Day 02

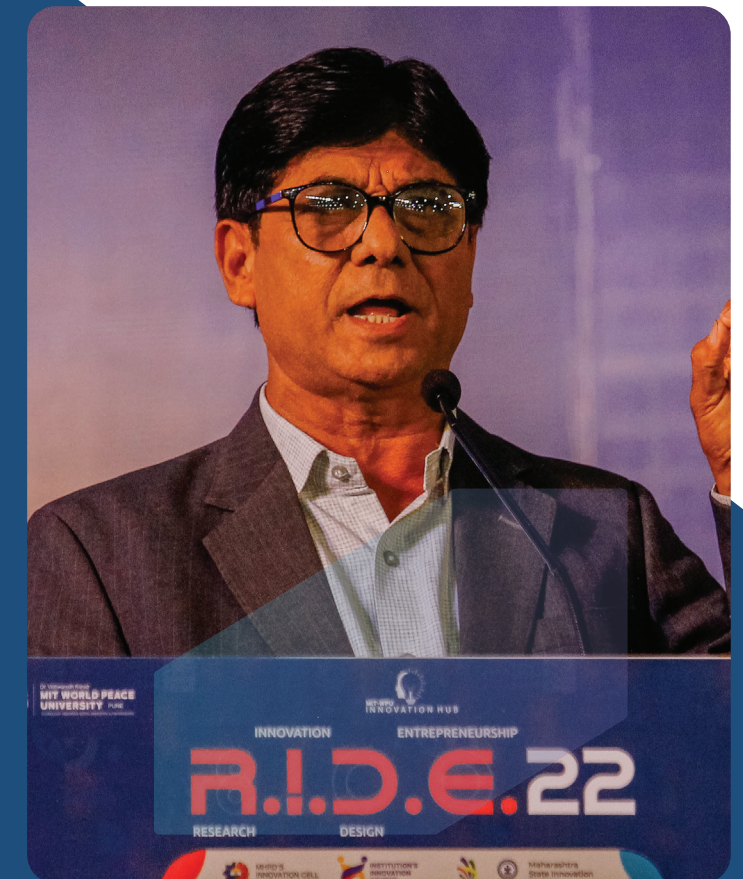
Mr. Mansukhbhai Prajapati Founder, MittiCool

On the second day of RIDE, we had the good fortune of getting to listen to the liberating words of Mr. Mansukhbhai Prajapati. He made the audience realize the responsibilities as the future generation that will take the world to the next stage. He spoke about many different things, first that innovation can come from anywhere and anyone and believing in that every occupation is respectful work. He mentioned that even a potter is capable of harnessing excellence and innovating for the betterment of the world even against highly unfavorable odds.

He taught the audience the importance about perseverance and determination to success.

He advised about not chasing money and fame. His work has been recognized & appreciated by a lot of respectful personalities, he was awarded the title of **'True Scientist'** by Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam in 2007. In 2010, he was named as 'India's most powerful rural entrepreneur' by the Forbes magazine. He ended his speech by leaving us with the message to persevere through all the hurdles and to keep going for what you believe in no matter how many problems come in the way of achieving your dream.

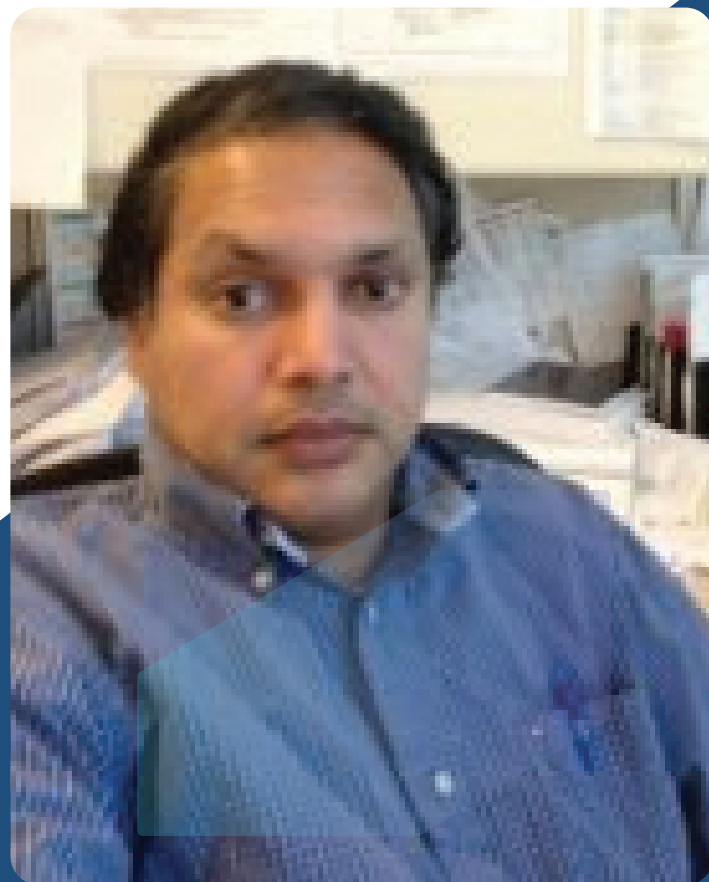


Mr. Deepak Kakadia

Google Extreme Networking

Mr. Deepak Kakadia hooked his audience with the very first sentence he spoke. "I'm going to talk about today how to make the best use of your capabilities." He then emphasized on the fact that numerous people, rooted to India, second guess the worth of a specific company when started in India, and as an entrepreneur, the biggest gap one might face is to understand the dynamic Indian market, to be able to devise an algorithm that fits the Indian logics. Mr. Kakadia believes that companies with far fewer people work harder.

He then spoke about the importance of Machine Learning and how people these days speak about it but do not know what it actually is.



"Machine learning in a nutshell, it programs a computer to teach how to solve something and learn it. So every machine learning algorithm is the same thing. You fit a model, you create a model, you fit it. And you try to predict what the next outcome will be based on the previous history and most of the machine learning right now is only for companies like Facebook and Google that takes recommendations is all guesswork". In his ending note he reinstated the fact that **one needs to be good and know his worth before he starts his own company.**

Mr. Apurv Nagpal

Faculty of IIM Ahmedabad

We had an immense pleasure to have Mr. Nagpal on the 2nd day of our event. With his Multi cultivated experience on a variety of aspects in science he was able to share numerous illuminating facts and stories about futurology and innovation.

He conducted a super interactive and fun session on some famous science fiction movies which engaged most of the audience out of curiosity.

He made the audience realize that **nothing is impossible if efforts and innovation are put in an idea.** From these clips he implied that things that were just a thought, and were presumably impossible then were present and fully functioning in today's world.

Starting with a clip from Star Wars 1977, he explained the technology of holographic projection which was just recently introduced.

Then he gave another example from a show Jetsons 1962 where he talked about the idea of a robotic home cleaner and how in today's date it has been possible to have them in the market now and just like that he made a great oration on the latest innovation and futurology.



Day 03

Ms. Shuchi Aggarwal Innovation Strategy Council, Accenture

On day 3 of our event, we had Ms. Shuchi Aggarwal with us. In her talk, the focus of her address was the value of Design Thinking in the workplace. She contributed to the Innovation Design division of a startup prior to her current position at Accenture. According to her, creating the future is the best way to anticipate it, and design thinking is the process to use when doing so.

She demonstrated this by using a case study of a GE MRI machine to show how the creator of the machine was completely taken aback when he first saw it in action in a hospital. The MRI machine won accolades for its original vision. Later, he learned that between 60% & 80% of the patients were children, which struck him seriously.



She requests that he look through the machine, behind which is showing a movie. She requested him to lay down on the bed and put on the headphones so he could watch the movie. After then, Jack was placed inside the device, and everything went as planned. **“The first phase of design thinking includes having empathy towards user while accomplishing the objectives”.**

In the end, through her case study, Ms. Shuchi demonstrated how the designer of the GE MRI Machine.

Dr. Jeetesh Agrawal Senior VP, Lenskart

Day 03

On Day 3, Dr. Jeetesh enlightened us on entrepreneurs, students, two facets of e-commerce, innovation, and design thinking, as well as how **E-commerce has assisted in connecting with individuals living in remote areas.** He explains that the three objectives are to address accessibility, any inefficiencies, and the more extensive needs of customers.

He begins by giving examples to illustrate his point on accessibility. He claims that, 7-8 years ago, there were many ways to absorb content, including TV, torrents, movies, and more. Netflix, Hoststar, Prime, and other content-producing companies have seen a phenomenal rise in the last 5-6 years. These businesses have closed the gap between

people living in tier-2 and tier-3 cities who couldn't access many items before.

Finally, he uses the example of Olx, a website that allows anyone to sell their motorcycle, cell phone, or anything else that could be useful to someone else in order to bring buyers and sellers together on one platform so that they can communicate and transact business at a price that both parties are willing to accept. Another example is UPI payments, which did not exist six or seven years ago. Payments were previously made by visiting banks or involving banks in the process; now, thanks to UPIs, payments can be made with a single click.



Day 03

Mr. Pravin Rajpal Founder, World InnovationNext Network Pvt. Ltd.

On the third day of RIDE, Mr. Pravin honored us by discussing the wave of digital disruption. He discusses how our smartphones have developed over time and now include everything we need. Then he talked about iDIA, an integrated all-in-one platform, where anyone can easily incubate ideas online. The integrated digital incubator and accelerator is what it is termed. The cost of the digital incubator is 1/100th of what it would be otherwise. He went on to discuss the six effective iDIA tools that can support a student's entrepreneurial path.

iWIN, iDEATE, iSTART, iRESEARCH, iASSESS, and iPRESENT are among the six tools.

He explained about all the products briefly through a presentation.

The main benefits from these tools is to make a better product according to market fit, reduce time to develop products, reduce time to market, faster scale-up with corporate accelerators, and globalize startups.

In the end with the help of a video clip from Brahmastra, he connected how we need to ignite and re-ignite our thoughts and with the help of passion, spirituality, and science we can bring great changes in the world.



Day 03

Mr Bharat Oswal CII Young Indians, Pune- YUVA Chair

Mr. Bharat Oswal started his speech by calling entrepreneurship the "Buzzword nowadays" and something which everyone wants to get into and how great it is for MIT to support this. He also expressed his gratitude for many cooperates joining. He also spoke on how many things have changed over the years in entrepreneurship. Lots of startups are developing across the country in every part, from rural to urban and from innovation to agri.

Quoting "Today we are in an era where everybody across the globe is looking at India, what new do we bring to the table."

He also mentioned startups like Udchalo, Elasticrun, and Dhruva which are putting Pune on a global brand.

He also gave a glimpse of the reality of how challenging startups can be but challenges also come up with opportunities which means that the focus needs to be on innovation. He also quoted "A startup is not just about having an app or having just a tech platform, it is about how tech can enable people to solve the problem". He ended his speech by explaining how Ideas are something that can come at any time and how it is used is going to decide how further one can go.



Day 04

Mr. Shreyansh Sancheti Co-founder, BlueLearn, Bangalore

"Ideas are commodities. Execution of them is not." Michael Dell
Mr. Shreyansh Sancheti immediately became everyone's inspiration after the audience found out that he has worked for 4 different companies, co-founded 2 startups, and raised venture capital while still in college. He defines perseverance as the word which can define the journey of an entrepreneur. One will fail if they don't have perseverance. He also shared his story of how he put himself out there without knowing anything about startups, encouraging everyone to do the same. He also spoke on how rejection is a part of this and not to be afraid of it.

He shared MVPs of brands such as Facebook, and Youtube and normalized simplicity.



He normalized failure and rejection, quoting "Ideas are a commodity but execution of them is not- founder of Dell".

He ended his speech by sharing the advice he would give himself 5 years ago which included:

- **To learn as much as you can and at as many places as you can.**
- **Talk to as many people as you can.**
- **College is the best place to try new things and it gives you exposure to new technologies.**
- **To find a co-founder.**

Day 04

Ashish Deshpande CEO, Elephant Designs, Pune

Ashish Deshpande shared his experience, being from Pune itself can see the beauty of it in daily life and he always drew inspiration from Indian cities. His journey in design began in Ahmedabad which is a very lively place and has had a very strong impact on the design of India. In 1983, he was enrolled at the National Institute of Design and his education was rooted at one end in the cultural fabric of the city and country but he also had an exploratory mindset to explore the skies.

He mentioned being influenced by the writer of the book "Designed for the real world" and suggested everyone read it. He worked with the blind man association and shared his experience.

He has also worked with children with polio disabilities, with the goal of designing a trainer to assist them in training their muscles to walk.

He discovered that Design, if done in the right spirit, had the power to change in several ways.

He quoted **"Problem solving in design has to always lead to a workable and acceptable solution"**. He also spoke about 3 pillars of design-led innovation.

- Adding positive values. We improve the present through this.
- Focus is on people. Quoting "We have to listen to them and their expectations."
- Responsible Impact. One needs to think about the impact one is creating.



Day 04

Kamlesh Thakur Chairman, Prime Investrade Ltd, Mumbai

Mr. Kamlesh Thakur defines an entrepreneur as "A person who relentlessly pursues their goal or goals and someone willing to be at risk whether it is a loss or profit and take a step forward". He shared how to build a startup based on an idea and focus points. He also explained how important it is to show the disruption one brings in and is equally important and can deliver much more than what is being offered in the existing line of the activity. Teamwork is also so important. He shared a few points on pitching one's ideas and gaining funds. Saying "You must have at least one institutional investor".

It is important to find the capabilities of an investor as they will be doing the most important part.



Quoting **"When you're an entrepreneur, if you have people who believe in your idea and are working with you, they have to align themselves together to achieve the goals that you all have put together to achieve."**

He ended by explaining how there are two pre-revenue stages of investment- the stage where you are putting everything as a team together, and once you start generating revenue, you are in two stages again.

Day 05

Chandan Tiwari CEO, Entrepreneurial Development Council

He started his speech by cheering up the crowd a little. He believes that it is not his story which is interesting, but the way he narrates it. He talks about basic life where he did his schooling, but he was not aware of what he really wanted to do and even proclaimed to become a truck driver as he wanted to explore the world. Later on, he learnt that his interest might lie in something more powerful, like becoming a politician.

Similarly, this decision changed and he became an engineer. From IIT to startup, he explored the world without any money to begin with. Beginning his entrepreneurial journey from zero, he shares a lot of naive

incidents related to his life from which he learns all sorts of finances that might help him through his journey to a rich future.

Even though he faced a lot of ups and downs and career changes in his life, he learned a lot from different occupations and focused on making some of them matter the most.

He quotes that **"You choose your best!"** and states that you should start to build a network and connect with people as you will excel in your life through knowledge and collaboration. You will always get options and opportunities. You have to identify what you are supposed to do with them.



Lt. Gen. A. Arun Indian Army

Starting his interaction with 'Jai Hind', Lt. Gen. A. Arun is a strict and driven individual. The biggest success will come from an entrepreneur's ability to smile. He presented an image of a Spanish cyclist who does not have an arm and a leg. He asked students to convey their thoughts through a single emotion, and many responded by expressing varied emotions like happiness, determination, enthusiasm, courage, passion, etc.

Failures are a part of one's life, but they do not determine anyone's aim. He states that failing is not a shame, but what is a shame is when you can not continue to achieve your aim. He even shared a motivational video of himself sharing his experiences throughout his life and even during war, fueling the positivity through students.

The stories he shared made the audience feel goosebumps and were highly encouraging.

Since we come from a diverse community, we are guaranteed to attain the best for all, just as a soldier does. The journey of becoming an entrepreneur posits a simple lesson: an entrepreneur is nothing without a team.

"The key to your happiness lies with yourself and no one else."

He quotes that "the key to your happiness lies with yourself and no one else." Do not give it up! At the end, he says that for the youth of today, they are challenged to be the glorious architects of India.



Panel Discussions

A thought-provoking conversation is all we need to inspire and motivate us, to make us wonder and to make us aware of the vastness of the world. It could set our brain fire the essential signals to generate innovative and novel ideas.

Discussions proved to be food for thought for the audience, which served the purpose of this flagship conclave.



Contemporary Topics

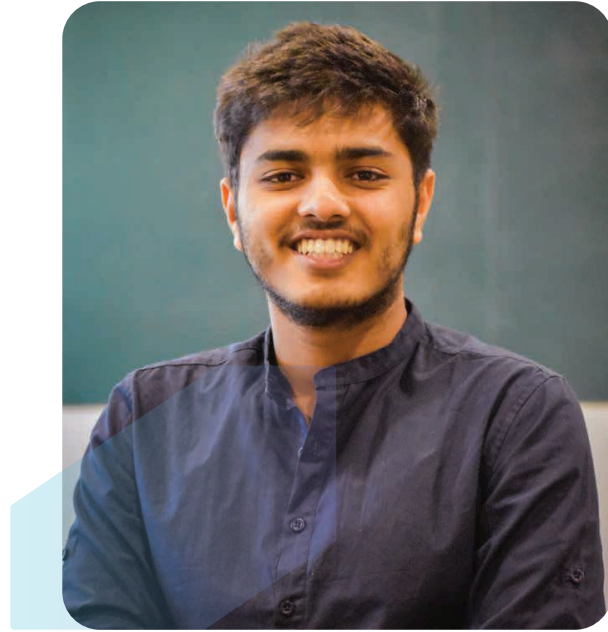

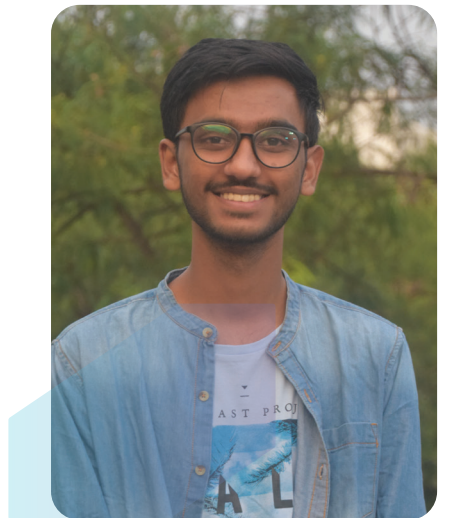

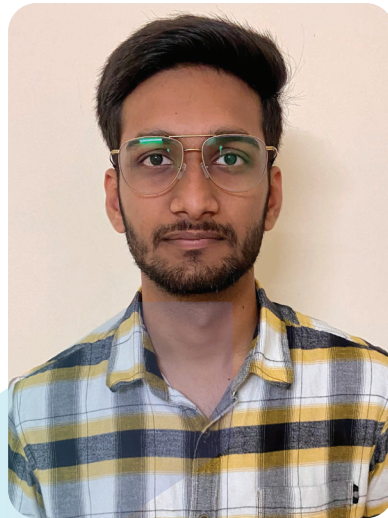
